A Transformation Strategy articulates a focused, deliberate path to revitalizing or strengthening a downtown or commercial district's economy. A program's work on Transformation Strategies should be organized around the Four Points: Economic Vitality, Design, Promotion, and Organization.

CURRENT PROJECTS AND COMMITTEES

Economic Vitality Committee

This group meets to find proactive ways that we can support the business district. We work to build relationships with building owners, landlords, business owners, and residents in order to bring a mix of businesses to the district that meet the community's needs.

Age Strong and Accessibility Committee

This group is developing a district-wide checklist and recognition program for businesses to become more accessible for customers with disabilities, in conjunction with the city's Age-Friendly/Dementia-Friendly certification program. Next steps will include finding resources to help businesses become more accessible and age/dementiafriendly.

JP Centre/South Main Streets, in conjunction with Little Dipper and Tres Gatos restaurants, hosted two workshops:

August 28 – "At Your Service: Welcoming Customers with Disabilities," presented by the New England ADA Center;

September 25 – "ADA Architectural Access in Boston," presented by the City of Boston's Commission for People with Disabilities.

Our Age Strong and Accessibility project committee grew out these workshops and sought to partner with the Age Strong Commission with the City of Boston. The overlap of customer service and architectural access for aging populations and people with disabilities inspired us to pursue a streamlined process for businesses who wish to strengthen their service for these customers.

Our project committee will partner with the city's Age-Friendly and Dementia-Friendly certification program and accompany them to businesses with an additional checklist that will assess accessibility and customer service for people with disabilities, ranging from wheelchair use to neurodiversity. In conjunction with the city's certification decal for being an Age-Friendly and Dementia-Friendly business, JP Centre/South businesses can earn additional recognition for being accessible for people with disabilities.
